This matter came before the Court for case management on December 20, 2005, in Department 512 of this Court, the Honorable Bonnie Sabraw presiding. Plaintiffs Karuk Tribe of California and Leaf Hillman ("Plaintiffs") appeared by Roger Beers; and Defendants California Department of Fish and Game and Ryan Broddrick ("Defendants") appeared by Mark W. Poole. New 49'ers, Inc. and Raymond W. Koons ("Miners"), who seek to intervene in this action, appeared by Neysa A. Fligor.


1. The Motion of Miners For Leave to Intervene, currently set for January 24, 2006 in Department 31 of this Court, is hereby continued to January 26, 2006 at 9:00 a.m., in Department 512. The briefing schedule is as set forth in C.C.P. §1005.

2. A further Case Management Conference will be held on January 26, 2006, following the hearing on the Miner's Motion. At that Conference, the Court will consider the appropriateness of entering the Stipulated Judgment proposed by Plaintiffs and Defendants. Miners are to file any objections they have to the entry of the proposed Stipulated Judgment, a copy of which Defendants provided to them at the Case Management Conference, on or before January 10, 2006. Plaintiffs and Defendants are to file any reply on or before January 20, 2006.

3. Each party is to serve the above papers, and a courtesy copy to Department 512, by personal delivery or by facsimile. The facsimile number for providing documents to Department 512 is 510-670-5687.

4. The hearing on the CEQA issues in this matter, currently set for February 23, 2006, is hereby vacated. Should the Court determine that a further hearing is necessary, a new hearing date will be set following the January 26 hearing.
