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- 3. Mining gold for me is really not about the money, though that is important, also. For me, it is the deep feelings of joy that I experience by finding Mother Nature's most valuable hidden treasure. The experience, at least for me, is something close to a religious experience. These moments help to balance a lifetime of hard work; and to a large degree, lots of painful sacrifice and memories.
- 4. I have been following prospecting most of my adult life, just waiting for the day when I could finally retire and experience my own "American Dream."
- 5. There was no dredging moratorium in place when I initially made my plans to move to Happy Camp. Since arriving here, I have long been waiting patiently for the moratorium to end.
- 6. This is because while I do recover some gold while pick and shovel mining on the banks, it really is not enough to make the effort worthwhile. I know that the real treasures are down the bottom of the river.
- 7. The problem is, that no matter how hard the mining industry tries, it seems like this dredging moratorium will never come to an end. I'm not getting any younger!
- 8. That's why I was so encouraged when this Court produced an Order a short while back announcing that the moratorium is unconstitutional and unenforceable by the state of California.
- 9. Even after the moratorium was overturned by this Court, I stood back and was horrified to hear about numerous events where local suction dredgers were being harassed, criminally cited, and arrested by state officials. How can this happen in America?
- 10. With all this going on, it seemed like just a step away from the Court providing an Order to stop the harassment, but that did not happen on the 23rd of June. As a veteran, I feel very betrayed that state law enforcement officers are being allowed to enforce something that has already been declared unconstitutional.
