

## How To Load & Access The South Umpqua Access Guide KMZ File

### **Step 1:**

First of all, you must have Google Earth installed on your computer. If you do not already have Google Earth, you can download and install it for free from this link: <http://www.google.com/earth/download/ge/agree.html>

### **Step 2:**

Once you have successfully installed Google Earth, simply “double-click” on the name of the KMZ or KML file that you wish to load – in this case, “South Umpqua Access Guide.kmz”. This will launch Google Earth and load the contents of this file into the “Temporary Places” folder in Google Earth.

### **Step 3:**

If you wish to add these locations to your Google Earth permanently, simply follow these instructions:

**Step A:** In the left hand pane of Google Earth, locate “Temporary Places”;

**Step B:** Directly under it, right-click on the name “South Umpqua Access Guide” and select “Save To My Places” from the context menu.

Now that you have the South Umpqua Access Guide saved into your Google Earth installation, you can “fly” to any point you want to look at by simply double-clicking on the name – such as “49SMC-1” to fly to an overview of the South Myrtle Creek claim.

You can, likewise, double-click on the access point (such as “49SMC-1A Access”) fly to a closer view of that point.
