Rip Ripple declares:

- 1. I am 74 years old and live in Happy Camp, California.
- 2. Before moving to Happy Camp, I was employed as an insurance agent in Maryland, and also as a tour bus driver. For reasons too lengthy to get into here, I was ultimately done out of retirement benefits from my earlier employment.
- 3. During the dredging season of 2006, I was privileged to work with Mark Chestnut, who was, at that time, a commercial suction dredger along New 49'er claims on the Klamath River.
- 4. I was aware that there were quite a few other commercial suction dredgers working New 49'er claims during those earlier seasons.
- 5. The gold recovery results obtained on Mark Chestnut's dredge were so impressive that after devoting a season with Mark, I changed my life plans and decided that I would ultimately move to Happy Camp and supplement my Social Security income by dredging for gold along the Klamath River.
- 6. In addition to the opportunity to make money, the exhilaration I experienced from uncovering raw gold along the bottom of the river was more than I could have ever hoped for when considering how to enjoy my final days on this earth.
- 7. I finally moved to Happy Camp during the summer of 2009. I arrived almost at the exact moment when the dredge moratorium was imposed on California suction dredging.
- 8. Since I was not allowed to suction dredge, I bought a high-banker so that I could supplement my meager income by digging for gold along the banks of the Klamath. While I have had some limited success with this, the gold recovery is quite small compared to what I would be recovering out in the river with a gold dredge.

- 9. Some people see me shoveling into a high-banker and write me off as a recreational miner, but recreation is the last thing on my mind. I'm just trying to survive.
- 10. Because the gold I was recovering from pick and shovel mining was not enough to make ends meet, more than 3 years ago I was forced to get a part time job driving a Siskiyou County transit bus.
- 11. My doctor informed me last year that even if I pass the physical, I will no longer be qualified to drive a transit bus when I turn 75 this next February. I'm at a loss for what I am going to do.
- 12. I have been patiently waiting since 2009 for the dredging moratorium to end so that I could resume my retirement dream. Early this spring, I had hopes that this Court was going to put an end to it. I cannot even begin to express my personal disappointment when that did not happen on June 23rd.
- 13. The activity of suction dredging is physical. At nearly 75, with no further job opportunities available, I am strongly concerned that my remaining opportunity to dredge for gold will not last much longer. Therefore, I am asking this Court to provide suction dredgers along the Klamath River with at least some limited relief.
